SMALL GROUPS

The Kingdom of God does not advance through words alone, but through people who understand their place, their calling, and their responsibility within God's plan. Every believer has been intentionally designed and sent with a specific assignment to make the Kingdom visible here and now. Our assignment in the Kingdom is deeply connected to our design: who we are, how we were formed, and the eternal purpose God placed within us.

Philippians 2:6–8 presents Jesus as the perfect model of someone who understood His design and faithfully fulfilled His assignment. Jesus did not act outside of His identity; on the contrary, His divine identity was precisely the foundation of His obedience. In the same way, when we understand our design in God, we can embrace our assignment without resistance, fear, or pride.

Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. Instead, he gave up his divine privileges; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross.

Philippians 2:6–8 (NLT)



TALK ABOUT IT

1. What does Jesus' example teach us about the relationship between identity and assignment?
2. Why do we sometimes resist certain assignments God gives us?

3. Let's read **Matthew 20:26–27 (NIV)**: *“Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave.”* How do humility and a servant's attitude help us fulfill our calling in the Kingdom?
4. Jesus clearly understood His purpose. What things today might be distracting us from our assignment?

Your assignment is connected to your design.

MAKE IT PRACTICAL

Your assignment:

- **Has a name:** Take time to write down your name, and next to it list the words God has used to identify you (child, called, chosen, sent). Reject comparison—your assignment is not someone else's.
- **Has a purpose:** Make a list of your gifts, talents, and life experiences, including those that have been painful. Then ask yourself: How can God use this to bless others?
- **Has a time:** Identify an area where you have been postponing obedience (a conversation, an act of service, a step of faith). Decide on a specific action and set a concrete date to take that step.

PRAYER

“Lord, thank You because You do not call us randomly, but with intention and love. Help us understand our design and embrace our assignment with humility and obedience. Remove fear, comparison, and delay from our hearts. We want to live to manifest Your Kingdom in every area of our lives. In Jesus' name. Amen.”

TIPS

- Do not underestimate small assignments: God uses them to shape your character.
- Your obedience impacts others more than you realize.
- If God showed you something, act on it this week. Revelation without action grows cold.
